VIZCAYA was built by businessman
James Deering (1859–1925), who wintered
on the property beginning in 1916.
The extraordinary European-inspired
estate, created by laborers and craftsmen
from the United States, the Caribbean and
Europe, is nestled in a subtropical hammock.

Vizcaya introduces visitors to a time when America's wealthiest industrialists created lavish homes inspired by the palaces of Europe. The Main House was intended to appear as if a family had occupied it for centuries, with its 34 decorated rooms reflecting a variety of periods and styles. Vizcaya also features innovative technologies and modern conveniences of the early 20th century.

The expansive gardens mix Italian and French design with plants that thrive in Vizcaya's subtropical setting. They showcase an array of statues, fountains and architectural follies. In addition to the Main House and gardens, the estate includes a village area that is being restored for future public enjoyment.

Vizcaya was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1994 and is accredited by the American Association



Location and Directions

Vizcaya is located at 3251 South Miami Avenue, just 1/4 mile off of I-95, one mile from downtown Miami, and 10 miles from south Miami Beach.



	By Metrorail	Proceed to the Vizcaya station. Cross US 1 on the pedestrian bridge. Continue in the same direction, 1 block to South Miami Ave. Cross SW 32 Road and proceed to the crosswalk. Cross South Miami Ave. to enter Vizcaya.
	From the South	Take US 1 (South Dixie Highway) north to SW 17th Ave. Turn right on SW 17th Ave. Turn left onto South Bayshore Drive/South Miami Ave. Turn right at 5th light into Vizcaya.
	From the North	Take I-95 south to Exit 1A. Turn right onto South Miami Ave. Turn left at 3rd light into Vizcaya.
	From Miami International Airport	Take 836 east and exit onto I-95 south. Follow I-95 south to Exit 1A. Turn right onto South Miami Ave. Turn left at 3rd light into Vizcaya.

Take I-395 or I-195 west and exit onto I-95 south. Follow I-95 south to Exit 1A. Turn right onto South Miami Ave. Turn left at 3rd light into Vizcaya.
