RELIVE the launches of the first Americans in space – the birthplace of NASA's space program.



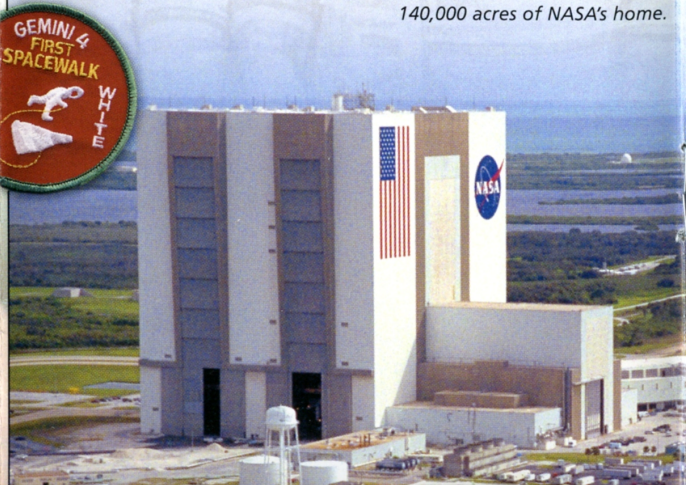
Discover KSC: *Today & Tomorrow*

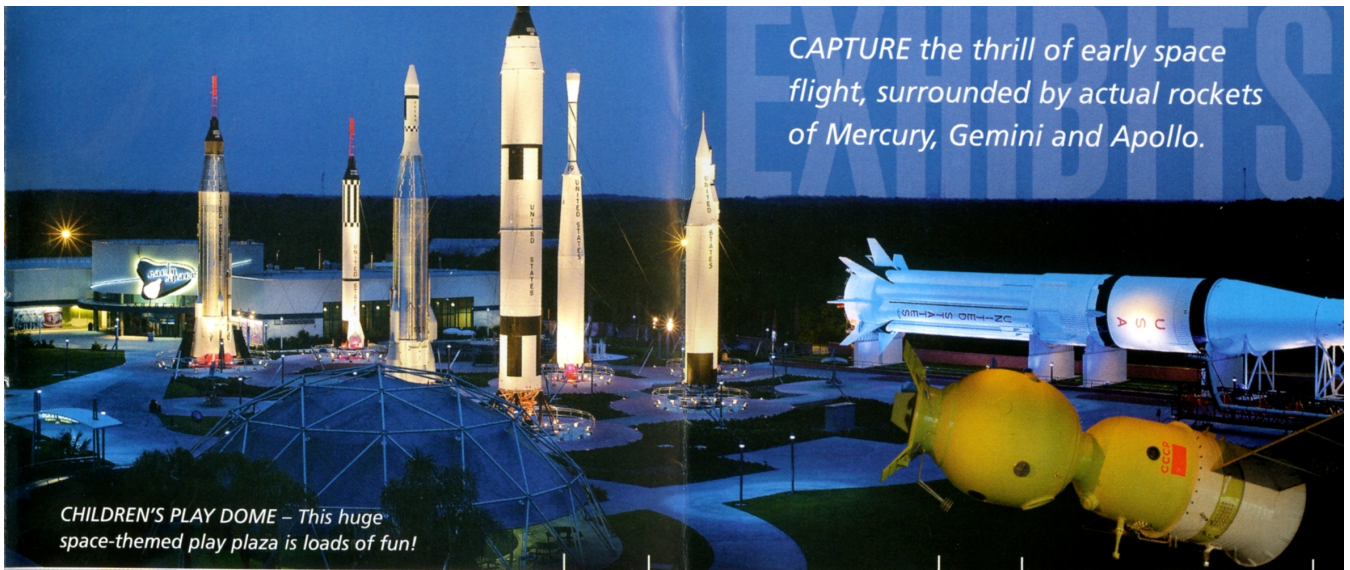

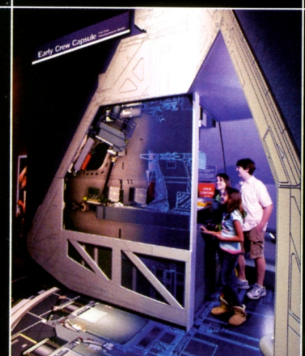

The Lunar Electric Rover

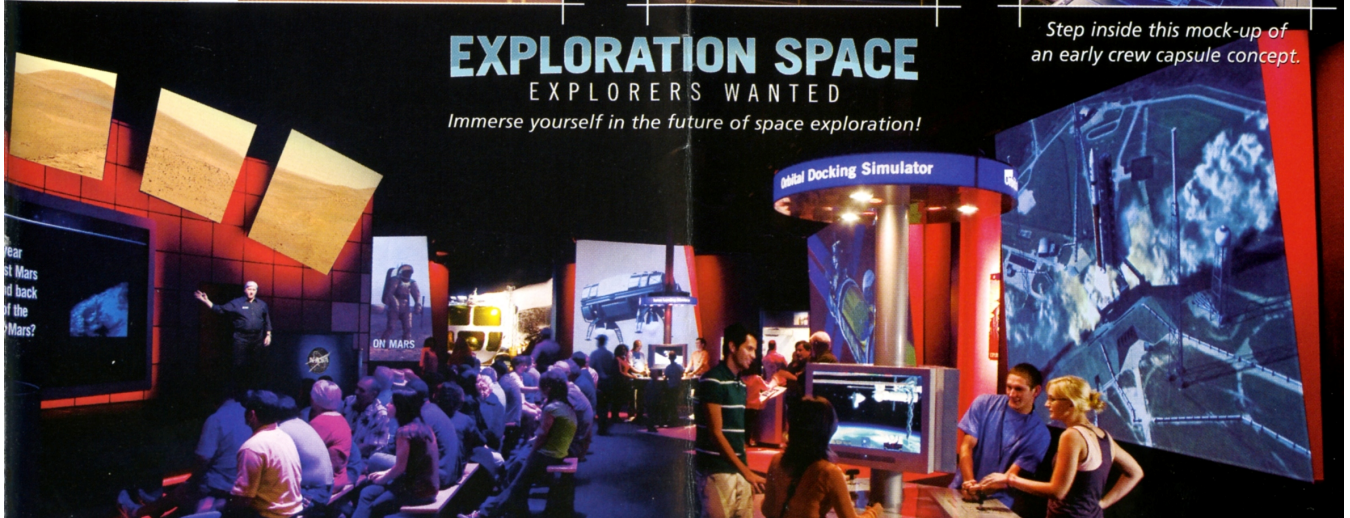
